Graham Hutton, who published his first *Journal* paper in 1992, will collect the abstracts of PhD dissertations in functional programming and present them in the *Journal*.

Lennart Augustsson (Commercial Uses), Robert Harper (Theoretical Pearls), Shriram Krishnamurthi (Education Column), Colin Runciman (Tools & Applications), and Simon Thompson (Book Reviews) complete the list of editors.
