# DEMOCRACY AND INTERNATIONAL TRADE

Britain, France, and the United States, 1860-1990

Daniel Verdier

In this ambitious exploration of how foreign trade policy is made in democratic regimes, Daniel Verdier casts doubt on theories that neglect voters. Verdier shows that special interests, party ideologues, and state officials and diplomats act as agents of the voters.

Constructing a general theory in which existing theories (rent-seeking, median voting, state autonomy) function as partial explanations, he shows that trade institutions are not fixed entities but products of political competition. Verdier then offers a thorough analysis of how foreign trade policy was made in France, Britain, and the United States during the period from 1860 through 1990. He discloses a reality startlingly different from previous understandings of American and French trade policies.






