UR-DRAMA: The Origins of Theatre by E.T. Kirby presents a much needed comprehensive study of the origins of theatre based on recent anthropological data. As the origin of drama is one of the best-known and most widely discussed scholarly problems in the academic study of theatre, this new work is particularly significant since it is the first book to be devoted to a study of the relation between shamanism and theatre.

UR-DRAMA contradicts the common view of the origin of theatre as having been founded in fertility worship and organized in a seasonal pattern. E.T. Kirby proposes that shamanism rather than nature worship gave rise to most drama: not merely classical Greek drama but diverse forms in many parts of the world. He demonstrates how many of the world's most important theatre forms—ancient Greek drama, Sanskrit drama of India, Chinese classical drama, and Japanese noh drama—were developed from early shamanistic rituals, rather than fertility worship. In its entirety, UR-DRAMA presents a detailed, general theory of theatre's origins which should replace that of the year-cycle, to become the standard reference in the field.




