24th September, FPS Chairman, Sir Peter Scott, will speak on 'The Wildlife of the Sub-Antarctic Islands', and his talk will be illustrated with colour slides by Lady Scott. Tuesday 28th October, Dr Lee Talbot, FPS Vice-President and the new Director General of IUCN, will speak on the World Conservation Strategy.
