To do this we are numbering the next issue of LARR, normally our Volume IV, number 1, as Vol. III, no. 4.

Those whose subscriptions began with III:1, III:2 or III:3 should renew with III:4, IV:1 or IV:2 respectively. Beginning with Vol. IV, no. 1 (Spring, 1969), the triannual cycle will be resumed but on a calendar-year basis.

LASA members, in good standing of course, will receive Vol. III:4 and upon renewal of membership dues for 1969 will receive IV:1, 2 and 3 in that year.
