Given for the first time in 1962, the Edward Kremers Award honours the memory of Edward Kremers (1865–1941), pioneer of American pharmaceutical education, distinguished American historian of pharmacy, and one of the founders of the American Institute of the History of Pharmacy. The award is made by the Institute, upon recommendation of a committee of professional historians, for a specific original publication or a series of related articles (including manuscripts) pertaining primarily to historical or historico-social aspects of pharmacy.
