




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Front Cover illustration: The functional mechanism of anti-merozoite antibodies. Antibodies to merozoite surface proteins can mediate several effector mechanisms, including complement fixation due to cytophilic antibodies that result in merozoite lysis of C3b opsonization; inhibition of merozoite invasion into the RBC; phagocytosis of IgG-opsonized merozoites; production of reactive oxygen species (ROS) or Nitric oxide (NO) in response to opsonized parasites and antibody dependent cellular inhibition (ADCI) triggered by IgG-opsonized merozoites.
