NEW AND SUSPENDED PERIODICALS

Boletín Mexicana de Derecho Comparado is published three times a year by the Instituto de Investigaciones Jurídicas of the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México. The bulletin includes articles on comparative law, legislative studies, bibliographical notes, book reviews, and information on meetings. Now in its fourth volume, an annual subscription costs \$8.00. A new "mini-journal," *Comparative Urban Research*, began publication in May 1972. It is the official newsletter of the Comparative Urban Studies Committee of the American Society for Public Administration's Comparative Administration Group and the Committee for Community Research of the International Sociological Association, and is sponsored by the CUNY Ph.D. program in Political Science and the CUNY Office of Urban Policy and Programs. Included will be bibliographic listings and brief abstracts of selected books, chapters, articles, and unpublished manuscripts (e.g., dissertations and conference papers); notes on current research, including progress reports and research inquiries; descriptions of available data sets; news of urban conferences and relevant panels at association meetings; institutional developments at urban centers and elsewhere; and special features such as review essays and methodological commentaries. Ethnica is a new anthropology journal published by the Centro de Etnología Peninsular del Consejo Superior de Investigaciones Científicas de Barcelona. Director of *Ethnica* is Claudio Esteva Fabregat. The journal first appeared in 1971 and will be published twice yearly. *Ethnica* prints anthropological research articles, with particular emphasis on the Iberian Peninsula; notes; and book reviews. The quarterly journal *Études Internationales* is the only French language publication in North America to deal with international affairs. It focuses mainly on foreign affairs, international cooperation, and international economic relations. The periodical is published by the Centre Québécois de Relations Internationales which is affiliated with the Institut Canadien des Affaires Internationales. The publication includes basic articles, research notes, and book reviews and listings. *Études Internationales* is now in its third volume. Antoine Ayoub, Université Laval, directs the journal. Ibero-Americana first appeared in 1971. This new mimeographed periodical is edited and published by the Institute of Latin American Studies, Stockholm, of which Dr. Mangus Mörner is director. *Ibero-Americana* is edited in English for the recently-organized Scandinavian Committee for Research on Latin America (NOSALF). This publication reports news on planned and on-going research projects and principal acquisitions of documentation on Latin America in Denmark, Finland, Norway, and Sweden. This publication was issued monthly and prepared by the Division of Foreign Labor Conditions of the Bureau of Labor Statistics. *Labor Developments Abroad* presented information and research on recent labor developments in foreign countries. Both the publication and the Division of Foreign Labor Conditions have been discontinued.

The Center for Latin American and Iberian Research of the Thunderbird Graduate School of International Management is now publishing articles on Latin American topics written by its students, in its *Quarterly Report*. Volume 4 (October 1971) contained articles on Bolivia, Argentina, Venezuela, and Chile.

The *Revista de Administración Pública* published by the School of Public Administration of the University of Puerto Rico has reappeared after a long absence. The *Revista* has announced a new policy of focusing on current problems, e.g. poverty, pollution, collective bargaining. The first issue of the new series, Volume IV, Number 2, September 1971, is a collection of the papers presented at the Seminario sobre el Problema de la Pobreza en Puerto Rico which was held April 29–30, 1970. Etiony Aldarondo Galván directs the *Revista* and School of Public Administration. The journal will be published twice a year. Annual subscription is \$2.00.
