Cover: Part of the Łambinowice Site of National Remembrance, Poland, being prepared for photographic documentation. Excavation of a 24 × 19m trench revealed 60 rectangular structures, each containing human remains, arranged in a grid pattern. Since 1870, successive prisoner-of-war and resettlement camps operated on the outskirts of the small village of Łamsdorf and the landscape of these former camps has been legally protected since the 1960s. Ongoing work is helping ensure that the identities of the Italian soldiers who died here during the Second World War are not forgotten.
