

The second of two books produced by the author after an eighteen-year study of the Yellow-eyed Penguin in Southern New Zealand. The first, published by the University of Kansas Press, related mainly to behaviour. This monograph has its main emphasis on population, and includes information on the pair-bond, incubation, the chick period, movement, juveniles, the influence of age on breeding biology, the penguin community, survival and mortality, and finishes with unique data on the moulting season.
