The contents of the *Art Libraries Journal* regularly include conference papers of the IFLA Section of Art Libraries.

The *Art Libraries Journal* publishes material in English, French, German, and Spanish; articles in languages other than English will normally be accompanied by an English summary.

In addition to articles and conference papers, the *Art Libraries Journal* publishes reviews of books about, or relevant to, art librarianship, and of bibliographies and major reference works within the broad area of the visual arts. Annual features include 'Bibliographies Update', normally published in the second issue of each volume, and an annual bibliography of art librarianship which precedes the index of *Art Libraries Journal* in the final issue of each volume. Letters from readers are always welcome as a means of continuing and developing discussion of issues raised in these pages.

Contributions are warmly invited, and should be submitted to the Editor; books for review may be sent to the Editor or to the Reviews Editor.

The *Art Libraries Journal* is published quarterly, and normally appears in March, May, September and January. It is published by ARLIS/UK & Ireland for the art library profession worldwide; readers' views, comments, and suggestions are sought and valued, and should be directed to the Editor.

The *Art Libraries Journal* is available worldwide with membership of ARLIS/UK & Ireland @ £30.00 (individuals) and £45.00 (institutions) per annum (surface mail) or £53.00 (air mail); it is also available separately outside the U.K. @ £38.00 per annum (surface mail), or £47.00 (air mail).
