### **MIND (National Association for Mental Health)**

Two five-day non-residential courses on the use of creative media with the mentally ill and the mentally handicapped are to be held at Camden Art Centre, Arkwright Road, London, N.W.3.

*The Exploration of Self in Projective Materials, 18-22 August 1975.* This course on the use of art, clay, graphics and three-dimensional techniques in work with the mentally-disordered in hospitals, day centres and activity groups, is for those involved with the creative abilities of psychiatric patients or disturbed people who are becoming more readily able to express themselves emotionally through media of various kinds. It will be limited to 30 participants, and there will be specialist tutorial help for those requiring it.

*Shared Experience in Art, Clay and Media, 1-5 September 1975.* This course is for those involved with the care and teaching of mentally handicapped young people in schools, hospitals, homes and the community. It will be limited to 30 participants.

### **Seventh Pahlavi Medical Congress**

The Seventh Pahlavi Medical Congress will be held from 24-29 April 1976, in the Medical School of Pahlavi University, Shiraz, Iran. The first three days will be devoted to a Postgraduate Course on *Medical Education: Principles into Practice*, and this will be followed by a three-day Multispeciality Biomedical Congress, which will include a session on Medical Education. The official language will be English.

### **VIIIth International Congress on Cybernetics**

  - Medicine and health policy
  - Medicine and non-therapeutic demands

The official languages of the Congress will be English and French.

### **International Computing Congress, MEDCOMP**

This British-sponsored congress is to be held in Berlin on 24–26 November 1976.
