THE NEW NESTLE GREEK NEW TESTAMENT

In previous meetings of the S.N.T.S. we have heard reports about the American Bible Society's project and about the second edition of the British and Foreign Bible Society. It is fitting that we should close this series of reports by turning our thoughts to Nestle's edition of the Greek New Testament and to the changes which it is shortly to undergo—fitting, because this is the oldest of all existing pocket editions, prototype of the British and Foreign Bible Society's first edition and just as closely related to this Society's second edition.
