Single issues of the Journal are available to institutions for \$10; single issues of the Bibliography, for \$20. Manuscripts should be typed on 81/2 × 11 bond, double-spaced, Footnotes should be in the form recommended in the MLA Handbook (N.Y., 1977), typed double-spaced, and placed at the end of the manuscript. Manuscripts, including footnotes, should not be more than approximately 35 pages in length; the original and two clear copies should be submitted.
