The happy co-operation which is to-day possible even in the handling of so controversial a subject has enabled the editors, one a Free Churchman and the other an Anglican, to call upon the best historical scholarship of both traditions.

In relating contemporary facts to their historical origins, the writers show the protagonists of 1662 and the ecumenical leaders of to-day grappling in their different ways with a common problem. Their work should provide an enhanced understanding of the problem and an impetus to further progress in solving it.
