

As the most careful antiseptis is absolutely necessary, the skin over and around the site selected for puncture (recommended to be made between the scapulæ) should be carefully washed with a proper solution—say one made by dissolving a “Soloid” of Mercuric Chloride in a pint of water. The Syringe itself should also be thoroughly sterilized before and after the operation by boiling it for five or six minutes. Full particulars as to this precaution are given in the pamphlet. In the absence of means whereby sterilization by exposure to the action of boiling water can be carried out, it may be well to point out that treatment with absolute alcohol does equally well.
