

Editors' Notes

Readers are reminded that the Journal is willing to publish occasional monographic supplements, with the support of funds provided by the Council on Research in Economic History. Contributions which would range from 60 to 125 printed pages will be considered for publication as separate issues, in Journal format, within this series.

Authors are invited to submit manuscripts covering original research within any area of the Journal's field of concern. Monographs submitted to the editorial office, University of Washington, will be assessed by the regular editorial board as well as by other expert readers.

Postgraduate students interested in pursuing research are invited to apply for the Eileen Power Memorial Studentship in Social and Economic History, now being offered for the year beginning October 1966.

The scholarship, tenable for one year with an option of applying for a second year, is of the value of at least £650 and may be held with other emoluments.

No printed application forms have been issued; but applicants may apply by letter *not later than April 4, 1966*, to the Registrar, the London School of Economics and Political Science, Houghton Street, Aldwych, London W.C.2. With the application should be included all relevant personal particulars, the names and addresses of two referees, and a brief scheme for the study of some subject in social or economic history. Other things being equal, preference will be given to a candidate offering to study such a field as it relates to some country other than that of his usual residence.
