

Egyptian Engineers in Search of Industry

PRINTS AND DRAWINGS COLLECTION

The American Institute of Architects Foundation has administered an important collection of historic architectural drawings, photographs, and prints since 1977. With the help of the National Endowment for the Arts and the College of Fellows, a one-year project was conducted to assess and to inventory the Collection. Most of the 20,000 documents had never been available for research and many had been stored unprotected in wooden crates. Rare 19th and 20th century architectural drawings were uncovered, including works by William Thornton, Ammi B. Young, Thomas U. Walter, Henry Bacon and Richard Morris Hunt.

At present, the Prints and Drawings Collection staff is arranging, preserving and describing the extensive architectural records of Richard Morris Hunt (1827 - 1895), one of the most influential architects of his time. Hunt's extensive architectural records, presented to the AIA in 1926, comprise the Collection's most significant group of records and constitute a major national resource. Hunt was the first American to study architecture at the *Ecole des Beaux-Arts* in Paris, and before an American school of architecture was founded, established an atelier in New York. His numerous commissions include *The Breakers* in Newport, Rhode Island, the Fifth Avenue wing of the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the pedestal of the Statue of Liberty and more than 225 designs throughout the United States. He was the first Secretary and third President of the AIA. An exhibition and catalog about Hunt is planned.

The project is funded currently by the National Historical Publications and Records Commission (NHPRC), the Institute of Museum Services (IMS), the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), the AIA, the College of Fellows, the AIA Foundation and the Egg and Dart Society. Hamilton Industries, Inc., Two Rivers, Wisconsin, also has supported the project by supplying plan files at cost.

The Prints and Drawings Collection was recommended recently for recognition by the Design Arts Program of the National Endowment for the Arts.
