# The Rising Tide

## AN EPIC IN EDUCATION

By J. G. LEGGE

THIS book gives a succinct, but well-documented, account of the remarkable progress made in secondary education since the passing of the Education Act of 1902, and calls attention to the great social changes which this portends. It ascribes the main credit for what has been achieved to the public spirit and generosity animating the Local Education Authorities of the country, and furnishes a vigorous defence of them, and of their officials, against misguided attacks from certain Head-Masters of Public Schools. An attempt is made to do justice to the invaluable service rendered by the teachers in elementary schools, whose careful preparation of their young people has done so much to ensure the success of the new secondary schools. The book concludes with a reference to the Consultative Committee's report on 'The Training of the Adolescent,' and with a short discussion of the new advance and change of direction likely to result from the raising, some day, of the school age to 15, and of the new responsibilities which are being incurred by Local Education Authorities.
