MEMORIAL OF E. J. WEISS

E. J. Weiss, 49, an Executive Administrative Assistant of the Georgia Kaolin Company, Elizabeth, New Jersey, passed away on June 14th, in Islamorada, Florida. The cause of death was pulmonary edema. Joe Weiss was born in Lancaster, Ohio. He received his B.S. degree in Ceramic Engineering at Ohio State University. He received his Ph. D. in Mineralogy in 1949 from the same institution. In 1950 he joined the faculty at the University of Texas, where he taught in the Ceramic Engineering Department. He remained with the University of Texas until 1963 when he resigned and became associated with the Georgia Kaolin Company in Elizabeth, New Jersey, as Assistant to the Executive Vice-President. Joe Weiss was very active in the affairs of the Clay Minerals Conferences. He was a member of the Committee on Clay Minerals when it was under the jurisdiction of The National Research Council and was a member of the Council of the Society during its first year of operation. He published several papers on clay minerals and was particularly instrumental in the development of the oscillating heating technique. He was a Fellow of the Mineralogical Society of America and a Fellow of the American Ceramic Society. He is survived by his wife, Helen, and three sons.

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
