The 1998/99 JLO Visiting Professor was Professor W P Coman from Brisbane, Australia who delivered lectures at the Royal Society of Medicine, Oxford, Nottingham, Bristol and Gray's Inn Road. The 1999 JLO Travelling Fellowship was awarded to Mr N B Kumar who visited Professor Fisch in Zurich and Professor van den Broek in Nijmegen. We look forward to publishing his report in the coming months.

We were pleased to welcome Professor Nicholas Stafford and Mr Robin Youngs as Assistant Editors and Dr Linda Hunt as a Statistical Adviser. We wish to thank Anthony Hughes for his hard work and services as an Adviser in Statistics which draws to an end this month and Mr Michael Rothera for his long service as an Assistant Editor which ended during the year.

The Millennium will mark a new chapter in the history of the *Journal*. Headley Brothers have been our publishers since 1933. Our predecessors have maintained the production of the *Journal* in their own offices but with an eye to the future the Directors have decided to appoint the Royal Society of Medicine Press as publishers but are delighted that Headley Brothers will continue to typeset, print and distribute the *Journal*. Principally the move to the Royal Society of Medicine will provide us with a permanent base in London and the association with an active medical publishing house. We shall look forward to working with them as well as with Roger Pitt, Richard Rice, Thelma Aspland and Sheila Hubbard at Headley Brothers.

Co-existent with these changes we will be modifying the Instructions to Authors and tightening up our acceptance criteria in order to try and further increase the quality of the material that we publish. These changes will be highlighted in the January editorial.
