REGIONAL DEVELOPMENTS

North-Eastern Regional Hospital Board, Scotland

Plans for a £500,000-plus improvement scheme at Woodlands Hospital, Cults, near Aberdeen, which cares for mentally handicapped children, are being submitted for approval to the Scottish Home and Health Department by the North-Eastern Regional Hospital Board. Included in the plans is new residential accommodation for 120 child in-patients at Woodlands, which at present has 112 beds. It is also planned to provide a new kitchen and dining room, and to alter and upgrade Woodlands House to provide administrative, clinical and teaching facilities.

The in-patients at Woodlands will be aged up to

16 years and there will be two types of ward—maximum care wards and progressive training wards, but these will be designed to be flexible in use for the care of all grades of patient. In all wards, any of the single rooms will be capable of accommodating a mother and child when mothers are resident and under instruction.

National policy now requires local authorities to play a larger part in the care of handicapped persons, but the extent of local authority participation in the Woodlands project by way of hostel accommodation and additional educational facilities is not yet known. The hospital project will therefore proceed in isolation meantime, and it is hoped to be able to start work on site in February 1976.
