Named in honor of the 1950 Nobel Peace Prize winner and former APSA President, Dr. Ralph Johnson Bunche, the Ralph Bunche Summer Institute is a five-week, academically intensive summer program designed to simulate the graduate school experience, provide mentoring, and expand academic opportunities for students from underrepresented groups such as African American, Latino/Latina, Native American, and Pacific Island students, and students who are interested in broadening participation in political science by students from underrepresented minority populations and pursuing scholarship on issues affecting underrepresented groups.

The Institute is hosted by Duke University, under the direction of Dr. Paula McClain, and includes two transferable credit courses, one in quantitative analysis and the other on race and American politics. Participants' transportation to and from the Institute, meals, housing, and course credit are provided by Duke University with a major grant from the National Science Foundation and additional support from APSA.

GOALS

The Institute endeavors to encourage students to pursue academic careers in political science by helping to:

- Enhance the writing, research, and analytical skills of the participants, making them more competitive applicants for graduate school admissions and financial assistance;
- Improve students' use of computers to statistically analyze data related to political science research;
- Expose participants to the key issues in the discipline and profession of political science; and
- Inform students of career opportunities for political scientists.

ELIGIBILITY

Students who from racial/ethnic groups that are significantly underrepresented in science in the United States, e.g. African American, Latino/a, Native American, and Pacific Island students, or who are interested in broadening participation in political science by students from underrepresented minority populations and pursuing scholarship on issues affecting under-represented groups, are eligible to apply. Applicants must be:

- United States citizens
- Completing their junior year of undergraduate study
- Majoring in Political Science or a related discipline
- Have an interest in attending graduate school in political science
