

rooms, furnishing, cleaning and rent contribution. I make a few group interpretations, the voluntary visitors discuss the way the mothers are handling their children and the mothers have opportunities of identifying with the behaviour of the voluntary visitors in their good mothering techniques with their children. Much aggression is expressed at these large group meetings but also true sadness and respect; for example when Mr Burrows Peakin, who was their obstetrician, died, they all stood in his memory. In addition the mothers have one weekly meal provided by the charity in each of the houses so that they live as a big family together whilst catering for themselves and their children independently through the rest of the week.

My purpose in writing is to stress how easily these houses are run without a Warden, which saves both her salary and the accommodation she would occupy, so that ordinary four-bedroomed houses are suitable, provided there is a breakfast room behind the kitchen and the lavatory and bathroom are separate. Coin box telephones are essential.

A further point is that I have had no difficulties with the neighbours of my houses, as they are taken into my confidence when the house is bought and their feelings are respected. As they are ordinary houses in ordinary roads feelings of resentment and envy from either the neighbours or the girls do not seem to be aroused. Finally, if other doctors would wish to have further details and copies of my Annual Reports I would be more than willing to send them. I consider that I give one day of voluntary work each week to the running of this Trust, so that in these times of inflation this is a most economical way of housing homeless under-privileged people; in my view it would save the country several million pounds which are at present spent on the psychologically destructive experience of living in bed and breakfast accommodation.
