# ART, ARCHITECTURE AND DESIGN: SOURCES, PRACTICE, LIBRARIES

ARLIS/UK & Ireland Annual Conference
University of Bristol
Thursday 2 - Sunday 5 July 1998

The 1998 ARLIS/UK & Ireland conference will be held at the University of Bristol's Clifton Hill House, an imposing Palladian mansion built around 1747, and once the home of Victorian writer and critic John Addington Symons. Clifton, perhaps Bristol's best known quarter, is mainly Georgian in character; its most familiar landmark is Brunel's spectacular Suspension Bridge spanning the Avon Gorge.

The conference takes as its theme the practical and technical aspects of art, architecture and design librarianship, including sources for the applied and decorative arts. Bristol and Bath are ideal locations for this theme with their wealth of artistic and architectural heritage.

On the first day introductory lectures will provide a back-drop to the art and architecture of Bristol and Bath, ending with an evening guided architectural walk through Clifton Village. Some notable places to visit in Bristol are the dockside Arnolfini Arts Centre, the City Museum & Art Gallery and the Bristol Industrial Museum.

Friday will be spent in the historic Roman city of Bath with a lecture and guided walks in the morning, followed by a choice of study visits each containing a particular study / sources/documentation element. It is hoped to include the Building of Bath Museum, No. 1, Royal Crescent, the Royal Photographic Society, Holburne Museum & Craft Study Centre, and the American Museum.

On Saturday delegates will be able to choose from a number of practical workshop sessions covering study skills, service promotion and display, copyright, quality assurance, income generation and fee-based services, surviving TQAs and cataloguing strategies in the digital age. The final day will address some of the current issues affecting art, architecture and design librarianship nationally and internationally.
