

A specially commissioned volume offering an assessment of the career and place in history of Mao Tse-tung. Ten individual chapters, each written by an internationally known scholar and past contributor to *The China Quarterly*, concentrate on a particular aspect of Mao's life or thought, and these chapters are supplemented by a number of impressions of Mao written by people who encountered him at first hand. The volume is intended for the general reader as well as the specialist and undergraduate. It is too soon for a final evaluation of Mao's remarkable life but this comprehensive collection of the best of contemporary Chinese scholarship will be an essential part of that evaluation.
