Owing to his knowledge of modern Greek and its literature, Dr. P. E. Shaw, Professor of Early Church History in Hartford Theological Seminary, is particularly well qualified to undertake a thorough and exhaustive study of this neglected phase of modern missionary history. He has utilized all the available material, English and Greek, in presenting the first searching history of all the various American missionary enterprises in Greece and partly in Turkey. The study comprises the history of the Greek Mission of the Protestant Episcopal Church, the Episcopal Mission to Constantinople, the work of the American Board in Turkey and Greece, particularly the heroic story of Dr. Jonas King, and a few lesser Protestant missionary ventures. It also includes a short history of the indigenous Greek Evangelical Church, the story of which would be difficult to find elsewhere. Dr. Shaw concludes his work with timely reflection upon the lessons to be drawn from the experience gained in these missionary contacts with a Christian people, as distinct from work among non-Christians. In view of the present interest in ecumenical Christianity, this study is eminently timely.
