

Early American Methodism

By **Russell E. Richey**

Offering a revisionist reading of American Methodism, this book goes beyond the limits of institutional history by suggesting a new and different approach to the examination of denominations. Russell E. Richey identifies within Methodist rhetoric four distinct "languages" and explores the self-understanding that each language offered the early (1770-1810) Methodists. One of these, a pietistic or evangelical vernacular, commonly employed in sermons, letters, and journals, is Richey's focus and provides a way for him to reconsider important interpretive issues in American religious historiography and the study of Methodism.
