Applications for grants are invited for financial assistance towards the undertaking, completion or publication of work that relates to any of the general scholarly purposes of the Roman Society, which are to promote the study of the history, archaeology, literature and art of Italy and the Roman Empire, from the earliest times down to about A.D. 700. Normally this assistance will be given to applicants of post-doctoral status or the equivalent. Grants will not normally be made towards expenses incurred in the preparation of a doctoral or similar thesis.


SLIDES COLLECTION

The Slides Collection contains over 6,500 coloured 35 mm slides covering a wide variety of subjects, including sites on the Greek mainland, the Greek islands, Cyprus, Rome, Italy and the Roman Empire, Etruscan tomb paintings, Greek vases, Roman frescoes and mosaics, the Roman army, and Roman Britain. Slides of artefacts form a large part of the collection and include bronzes, jewellery and vases as well as maps, plans, models and reconstructions. A detailed subject index is available.















A. Post-Roman (Phase 5) rubble spread from the east at Woolaston. Scale: 2.0 and 1.0 m. (p. 180)






