This study examines the architectural and sculptural remains at the ancient city of Sukhothai, Thailand, once a flourishing Buddhist religious community and powerful political center. In a discussion accompanied by 184 photographs and other illustrative materials, the author establishes a detailed chronology of 53 Theravada assembly halls in 42 Sukhothai monastery compounds. The results suggest that the city did not reach its zenith of religious and architectural development in the thirteenth century, as commonly believed, but only in the latter half of the fourteenth century.
