

Membership in the association is open to persons who are professionally interested in the modern languages and literatures. For libraries and other institutions, an electronic and print subscription for 2007 is \$180, and it includes the electronic and print editions of *Profession*, the MLA's annual journal of opinion about the modern language profession.
