

## NEW PUBLICATIONS

The first volume, now in preparation, will be Latin America in Soviet Writings, 1959–1964: A Bibliography, being prepared by the Slavic Division of the Library, under the general direction of Dr. Sergius Yakobson. A second volume, covering the period 1917–1944, is also contemplated. Publication of both volumes is expected in early 1966.

Manuscript materials relating to Indian languages in America—Different lists are being compiled by Dr. Howard F. Cline, Director, Hispanic Foundation, Library of Congress.

### UNESCO

The UNESCO Mobile Microfilm Unit has spent considerable amounts of time in a number of countries reproducing manuscripts and documents. Countries visited and numbers of pages photographed in each include Barbados (120,000), Chile (250,000), Dominican Republic (156,000), Paraguay (157,000) and Peru (135,000).

UNESCO has provided numerous experts to advise on the establishment of new services: J. K. Thompson undertook two missions to Argentina in connection with establishing an International Documentation Center, and Miss Edith Wise served as consultant on the Center's development. Two grants totaling \$24,000 were made for books, equipment and salaries in the Center.

*The Latin American Times*

This is the first English-language daily newspaper in the USA devoted exclusively to Latin American affairs. Publisher is Leonard Saffir and its Editor-In-Chief, Jorge Losada, for 13 years the editor of Visión Magazine. Executive Editor is Roberto Mujica Lainez, while Virginia Prewett, winner of a María Moors Cabot Award in 1964, is the Editor of the Editorial page.

The Latin American Times, besides information from wire services and its own correspondents and stringers in Latin America, has a distinguished roster of contributing writers, including IAPA President Pedro G. Beltran of La Prensa of Lima, Perú, a former Prime Minister of Perú; former Presidents of Argentina Arturo Frondizi and General Pedro E. Aramburu; former USA Assistant Secretary of State and former Ambassador to Brazil Adolf Berle; Roberto García Peña, Editor of El Tiempo of Bogotá, Colombia; and former President of Colombia, Eduardo Santos.

The newspaper is of standard format, with a minimum of 8 pages, and is published Monday through Friday, world-wide distribution. Started publication in June, 1965.
