

The Anabaptist View of the Church

By Franklin H. Littell. Price \$2.50.

This long-awaited Brewer Prize Essay of the American Society of Church History is now coming from the press.

The new Dean of the Chapel of Boston University has made a major contribution to the expanding literature on the Left Wing of the Reformation. By using largely neglected sources, Dr. Littell has illuminated the origins of "sectarian" Protestantism and cut through the loose language about "enthusiasts", "spiritualists", and "mystics", still widely prevalent. The key to the understanding of the essence of Anabaptism he finds in their doctrine of the church, based on the effort to recover a primitive pattern. This very doctrine, moreover, has proved their most significant contribution to Protestantism as a whole. American ministers and historically-minded laymen will find here much illumination as to the origins of things they now take for granted.

Dr. Littell is a Methodist minister, trained at Cornell College, Yale, and Union Theological Seminary, who has recently resigned the direction of the office of Religious Affairs in the American Military Government in Germany to take up his present post at Boston University.
