

NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

The *Journal of Linguistics* is concerned with all branches of theoretical linguistics. Preference is given to Research Articles which present analyses or generalisations based on sound empirical work, which results in making a clear and original contribution to current debate in theoretical linguistics. Papers should be accessible to non-specialist linguists with an interest in the paper's topic.

The journal also provides an excellent survey of recent linguistics publications, with Book Reviews and Review Articles on major works marking important theoretical advances. The journal includes a Notes and Discussion and a Squib section for briefer contributions to current debate. The Editors also welcome proposals for overview papers for the Looking Back, Moving Forward section and for special issues.

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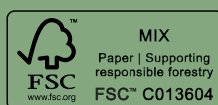
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
