AUSTRIAN SCHOLARSHIP

The Austrian Ministry of Education will again grant a limited number of scholarships for the academic year 1971–72. One or more of these scholarships can be awarded to American graduate students now working on doctoral dissertations or other research projects in the field of Austrian history. These scholarships carry a monthly stipend of 4,600 Austrian shillings (roughly \$177) for nine months. They are definitely not to be used to supplement a stipend received from another scholarship or fellowship. Holders of these scholarships are expected to be in residence at an Austrian university and should have a good command of the German language. The grant itself covers only the cost of tuition and maintenance for a single person. Candidates wishing to apply should send a letter of application together with letters of recommendation and other supporting material including an outline of their research project directly to Professor Robert A. Kann, Department of History, Rutgers University, New Brunswick, New Jersey 08903, before December 1, 1970.
