British Documents on the End of Empire Project. The aim of the British Documents on the End of Empire Project is to do for the former British colonial empire what Nicolas Mansergh did for the end of empire in India in his twelve volume collection of documents, *The Transfer of Power in India*, 1942-1947. These have become an indispensable tool for students concerned with the transfer of power to India and the creation of Pakistan.

No such collection of documents yet exists for the former British Colonial Empire. It is the aim of the British Documents on the End of the Empire Project to make good this gap. Over a twenty-year period selections of documents related to the negotiations over the transfer of power by Britain to her former dependent territories will be published as the Public Record Office releases the relevant documents under its thirty year rule. The first territorial study will be Sri Lanka; the last Zimbabwe since the last of the documents for the year of its independence in 1980 will only be released in 2011. The documents published in this project will focus on the way decisions were arrived at in Whitehall: it is hoped that the countries concerned will in turn publish documents in their own archives which will help illuminate the 'transfer of power' from the perspective of former colonial subjects, as is now being done in India.

The project is to be based at the Institute of Commonwealth Studies in the University of London. It is being overseen by a Project Committee of which Professor Anthony Low of the University of Cambridge is Chairman, and Professor Shula Marks, Director of the Institute of Commonwealth Studies, is Vice-Chairman. The General

Editor is Professor Michael Crowder of the Institute of Commonwealth Studies and Amherst College, Massachusetts.
