REGIONAL DEVELOPMENTS

Newcastle Regional Hospital Board

The Nuffield Child Psychiatry Unit at the Fleming Memorial Hospital, Newcastle, is to have extensions costing about £20,000. There will be an activities unit for young children and also enlarged facilities for the assessment of young non-communicating and brain-damaged children. Work is due to begin in the Spring and finish next Autumn.

Scottish Western Regional Hospital Board

The Department of Psychiatry at the Eastern District Hospital, Glasgow, has acquired a new Day Unit. The unit, which is housed in new premises erected at a cost of £25,000, was opened last November. It currently caters for 15 patients and is staffed by a psychiatric registrar, a staff nurse, an auxiliary nurse, a ward hostess, an occupational therapist and a voluntary worker.

MENTAL HEALTH RESEARCH FUND

The interviews for candidates short-listed for the annually-awarded Mental Health Research Fund Fellowships took place on 1 November, 1971. Nine persons were short-listed from 22 applicants, and of these two were awarded Fellowships.

Dr. M. J. Crow, Senior Registrar at the Maudsley Hospital was awarded a two-year Fellowship to carry out a clinical trial to determine whether evocative psychotherapeutic or directive behavioural intervention is more effective in producing changes in behaviour and attitudes in patients undergoing conjoint (family) therapy.

Mr. C. Bradshaw, Physiological Psychologist working in the Department of Psychiatry, University of Edinburgh, was awarded a Bates Fellowship for research in schizophrenia. This Fellowship is for a period of three years, and Mr. Bradshaw will study the role of monoamines in synaptic transmission in the C.N.S. by the technique of microiontophoresis.
