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Theatre Survey is chartered by the American Society for Theatre Research as a theatre history journal. Its theatrical and historical orientations are both broadly conceived. Performance-centered studies are welcome from all points across all historical, cultural, and methodological spectrums, as are historiographic studies. Studies of dramatic literature not substantively related to actual performance normally would be outside of the purview of the journal.

Articles submitted are subject to a juried review by members of the American Society for Theatre Research; this process may take about four months. Usually, manuscripts should be between 15 and 50 pages in length. All manuscripts should be prepared according to the *Chicago Manual of Style* (14th Edition) and should be provided both on disk, preferably in WordPerfect 5.1 + or in another IBM-based software application, and in two hard copies (to facilitate juried review). Illustrations are welcomed. A self-addressed, stamped envelope is required for return of manuscript and/or disk.

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
