


William Portier's new book, an introductory text for undergraduate theology courses, fills a textbook need that has long existed. With insight from his own teaching experience, he has written a clear, accessible volume presenting Christian theology as a humanities discipline in which the Bible, supplemented with the creed and other traditional sources, is the primary text to be interpreted. The book's fourteen chapters, one for each week of a typical semester, are divided into two parts. Part one treats fundamental theological ideas concerning revelation and part two dwells on Christological themes.


