Authors are informed that the Journal is now published online through First View in advance of print publication.

Submissions should be made electronically, formatted in ‘word.doc’ form and accompanied by a ‘pdf’. Delivery should be by email attachment to the editorial office at cdb@royalasiaticsociety.org. If non-Roman scripts or characters are used, these should be rendered in Unicode. We strongly discourage submission of articles formatted in ‘TeX’ or in hardcopy. Occasionally authors may wish to send CDs or USB-sticks to the editorial office by post. Submission of an article, or other item, implies that it has not been published or accepted for publication elsewhere. Authors are responsible for obtaining written permission to publish, in both print and electronic media, material for which they do not own the copyright and for ensuring that appropriate acknowledgements are included in their draft text or typescript. Authors of material accepted for publication will be asked to assign their copyright to the Royal Asiatic Society.

Authors will receive electronic proofs directly from CUP but in cases where an author does not have online access the Journal’s editorial office will dispatch hardcopy proofs. All corrections should be returned to the Journal’s Editorial Office.
