The Society was formed in 1910 to promote the study of the archaeology, art, literature, and history of Italy and the Roman Empire down to about the year A.D. 700, by publishing journals, forming a library, and holding meetings.

The Journal of Roman Studies is published annually and contains articles written by leading British and foreign scholars and reviews of recent publications. It is abundantly illustrated. The Society also publishes Britannia, devoted to Romano-British and connected studies, to which the annual survey of Romano-British excavations, previously published in the Journal, is now transferred.

The Society maintains, in conjunction with the Hellenic Society, a joint library of works on classical antiquity and a collection of lantern slides. Members are entitled to borrow books and slides, which can be sent to them by post, and may also consult books in the library of the London University Institute of Classical Studies, which is complementary to that of the Societies.

The annual subscription is £9.00, which entitles members and schools to one of the publications (£14.50 for both). Institutions pay £10 for each publication. Life membership for members of five years' standing and of age 65 or over, £45. Student associates £4.00.

#### THE CLASSICAL ASSOCIATION

The main aims of the Classical Association are to promote and sustain interest in classical studies, to maintain their rightful position in universities and schools, and to give scholars and teachers opportunities of meeting and discussing their problems. It organises an annual conference, lasting four or five days, in a university centre, and sponsors over 30 branches, which arrange programmes of lectures and discussions and many of which hold Greek and Latin Reading Competitions for Schools. Its activities are fully reported in its annual Proceedings, issued free to all members.

The present membership of the Association is approximately 4,500. Membership is open both to individuals and to institutions (annual subscription, £1.00; life subscription, for individuals only, £21.00). Members may obtain the Classical Review and Classical Quarterly at reduced prices (Review, £7.00; Quarterly, £7.00; combined subscription £13.00). Greece and Rome may also be obtained through the Association for an annual subscription of £4.25. Applications for membership and subscriptions for the journals (which should normally be received by January 31st in each year) should be addressed to the Treasurer, Mr. G. R. The Association can also supply copies of the Index to the First Series of the Classical Review (price £1.25 for members, £1.50 for non-members, post free) and of the last two issues of The Year's Work in Classical Studies, covering the years 1939-47 and 1945-47 (price £0.30 each volume, post free). These publications and details of the various occasional publications of the Association, including all Supplements to Greece and Rome, are obtainable from the Treasurer.
