INTENSIVE COURSE IN OTOLOGIC SURGERY

AN intensive course in Otologic Surgery will be given 13 to 17 January 1975, by the Ear Research Institute (formerly Los Angeles Foundation of Otology) and the University of Southern California School of Medicine in co-operation with St. Vincent's Hospital in Los Angeles, California.

The Course will consist of lectures, televised surgery and motion pictures on the following subjects: chronic otitis media, otosclerosis, pediatric otology, glomus tumors, acoustic tumors, facial nerve paralysis, and the dizzy patient.

A tuition fee of \$500 at the time of application, is payable in United States currency to the Ear Research Institute. This fee includes the cost of noon luncheons.

Tuition for doctors on active duty in the United States Armed Forces and residents in otolaryngology has been reduced to \$200. Applications from residents must be accompanied by a letter from their Chief of Service.

TEMPORAL BONE SURGICAL DISSECTION COURSE

THE Ear Research Institute (formerly the Los Angeles Foundation of Otology) announces a two-week Temporal Bone Surgical Dissection Course demonstrating the multiple approaches to the structures of the temporal bone as currently used by the members of the Otologic Medical Group, Inc.

The Course members will be divided each day to observe televised surgery that will correlate with the dissections of the day. Evenings will be devoted to lectures and motion picture demonstrations.

The instructors will dissect in the temporal bone laboratory over closed circuit television and each student will be supervised at the various procedures and approaches that are performed.

Twenty board certified or board eligible otolaryngologists and residents will be accepted in each course. Courses will be presented 23 February to 7 March, 16 to 28 March, 6 to 18 April, 17 to 29 August, 7 to 19 September, 1975. The tuition fee for otolaryngologists is \$1200 and for residents \$900 in United States currency. Applications of residents must be accompanied by a letter from their Chief of Service.
