The Making of Colonial Lucknow, 1856-1877

Veena Talwar Oldenburg

Examining the history of Lucknow after the Mutiny of 1857, Oldenburg contends that the supposedly neutral political, social, economic, and physical changes made in the city at that time constituted aggressive and purposive control of the population and that these changes continue to be accepted by contemporary Indian administrators in lieu of more appropriate ones based on societal welfare.

What was the relative importance of China's impact on Vietnam and Vietnam's response to China up to the 10th century, and why did Vietnam reassert its independence at that time, after a millenium of Chinese rule?

Vietnamese history up to the 10th century has often been treated as a branch of Chinese history but today the Vietnamese side of the story is increasingly difficult to ignore. Dr Taylor's scholarly book uses both Chinese and Vietnamese sources to obtain a balanced view.

Challenging accepted assumptions about the “backwardness” of the Chinese city, this study portrays Hankow as the hub of an empire-wide marketing system spanning thousands of miles and involving scores of commodities, and as a focal point of the indigenous developments leading toward later industrial and political revolutions. \$39.50
