### Contributors

Articles can be written in English, French or German. Please send your manuscript in both Word (or equivalent) and pdf formats. For refereeing purposes, we need a version in which all identifying information (name, institutional affiliation etc.) is removed; *IRAQ* uses a double blind refereeing system.

Articles may be submitted in English, French or German, and must include:

- an abstract suitable for translation into Arabic;
- a bibliography or full list of references;
- the editors request the name-date system of referencing (e.g., Mallowan 1954);
- and your address and email for academic purposes.

Where possible, abbreviations should match those current in *The Assyrian Dictionary of the Oriental Institute of the University of Chicago*.

Please use a Unicode font if your paper includes special characters such as used in cuneiform transliteration, for example.
