The Contributors

Nathan Leites is Research Associate in Political Science at Yale and consultant on Research in Contemporary Cultures at Columbia. His article on "Psycho-Cultural Hypotheses about Political Acts" appeared in the first issue of *World Politics*. *David Nelson Rowe*, a specialist in Far Eastern affairs, is Associate Professor of International Relations and Research Associate in the Institute of International Studies at Yale. He is the author of *China among the Powers*.

William Yale has been associated with the government, in connection with Near Eastern problems, during both World Wars. He is Associate Professor of History at the University of New Hampshire.

Phillips Talbot engaged in a first-hand study of India as a fellow of the Institute of Current World Affairs. He is now Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of Chicago.

Sigmund Neumann is Professor of Government and Social Science at Wesleyan University. He is the author of *Permanent Revolution*, and a co-author of *Makers of Modern Strategy*.

R. Barry Farrell did his undergraduate work at Queen's University in Canada. He is presently a University Fellow in the Department of Government at Harvard.

Eugene V. Rostow is Professor of Law at Yale, and author of *A National Policy for the Oil Industry*. During the war he served as Executive Assistant to the Assistant Secretary of State, Lend-Lease Adviser in the Department of State, and Executive Vice-Chairman of the North African Economic Board.

Louis N. Ridenour, Jr., is Dean of the Graduate School in the University of Illinois. Among his wartime posts were those of Expert Consultant to the Office of the Secretary of War, and radar adviser to the United States Strategic Air Forces in Europe. He is a Fellow of the American Physics Society.

Harold Sprout is Professor of Politics at Princeton. In collaboration with Margaret Sprout, he has written *The Rise of American Naval Power*, and *Toward a New Order of Sea Power*, and edited *Foundations of National Power*.

Adam B. Ulam is Instructor in Government and Staff Member of the Russian Research Center at Harvard.

Grayson Kirk is Professor of International Relations and Acting Director of the School of International Affairs at Columbia. He is the author of *The Study of International Relations*.
