Editorial note

This, the tenth volume of *Architectural History*, appears in a new form which it is hoped will meet with the approval of readers. Designed to produce a less bulky and more easily read volume, the improvements have necessitated a change in printing technique and with it, reluctantly, a change of printer. This, then, is an appropriate place to acknowledge the excellent work carried out over the past ten years by the Department of Photography of the University of Newcastle upon Tyne. The department's Printing Section has been responsible for the production of nine volumes of the journal and an extremely happy relationship has grown up between it and the Society. In particular the Society's appreciation and gratitude must be expressed to Dr C. I. C. Bosanquet, Vice-Chancellor of the University, Mr C. J. Duncan, Director of the Department of Photography, and Mr G. B. Hall, Manager of the Printing Section.

In the present volume the Society is privileged to publish two important scholarly works. The Kings Weston Book of Drawings, a valuable source document, has been edited, catalogued and described by Dr Kerry Downes of Reading University and is now for the first time published in its entirety. Dean Addleshaw's meticulous list of architects, artists and craftsmen associated with York Minster over the last 300 years (together with the work they carried out there) will be welcomed as an extremely useful work, to be followed, it is hoped, by other similar studies.
