Created for the Royal Exchange Theatre Company, the Mobil Playwriting Competition is now widely recognised as a major source of new writing.

The first two competitions were an outstanding success. The second competition attracted over 1,600 entries from 25 countries.

The Mobil Playwriting Competition is open to anyone who can submit an original full length play written in English.

The winning plays will be chosen by a distinguished panel of judges, chaired by Ronald Eyre and including Prunella Scales, Josephine Hart, Gregory Hersov, James Maxwell – and the joint winner of the first competition, Robin Glendinning.

This book traces the career of the Russian theatre director, Vsevolod Meyerhold, from the height of his fame and influence after the Revolution to his demise in the Stalinist era. Robert Leach examines Meyerhold's early years as a founding member of the Moscow Art Theatre with Stanislavisky and Nemirovich-Danchenko, his Symbolist period, his experiments with commedia dell' arte and other popular forms, to his glittering triumphs in the Tsarist imperial theatres and beyond.

This book is an historical and critical survey of the great tradition of German drama in the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. It provides an introduction of the great authors and works from Lessing, through Weimar Classicism, Schiller and Goethe, to Kleist, Grillparzer and Hebbel. F. J. Lamport traces the rise and development in the German-speaking world of the last form of 'classical' poetic drama to appear in European literature.

Ibsen's Lively Art

A Performance Study of the Major Plays

This study of Ibsen's works explores key stage productions of six major Ibsen plays, from *Peer Gynt* to *John Gabriel Borkman*.
