## Hellenic and Roman Societies SLIDES COLLECTION

The Slides Collection contains over 65,000 coloured slides (35mm), covering a wide variety of subjects, including sites on the Greek mainland, the Greek islands, Cyprus, Rome, Italy and the Roman Empire, Etruscan tomb paintings, Greek vases, Roman frescoes and mosaics, the Roman army and Roman Britain.

Individual slides, sets and filmstrips with notes may be hired by members. Filmstrips are also available for purchase. A set on Greek athletics, with notes by Dr Stephen Instone, is now available for hire or purchase as a filmstrip. Details of current charges may be obtained from the Keeper of Slides.

The Society for the Promotion of Hellenic Studies PRESIDENT: PROFESSOR J.P. BARRON, FSA The Society was founded in 1879 to advance the study of Greek language, literature, history and art. It maintains conjointly with the Society for the Promotion of Roman Studies, and in association with the Institute of Classical Studies of the University of London, a Library of some 82,000 volumes with c. 500 current periodicals, and a collection of over 6,500 coloured slides, including sets of slides with notes, and film-strips. Books and slides can be sent to Members by post; enquiries should be addressed to the Librarian at the above address.

Four lecture meetings are held in London each year and there are joint meetings with the Classical Association in various

parts of the country.

Subscribers receive the Society's two annual publications: The Journal of Hellenic Studies, one of the foremost British periodicals in the field of Greek scholarship, containing articles, notes and book reviews, and Archaeological Reports, an illustrated account of new discoveries in Greece and Greek lands. Both periodicals are also on sale to the general public.

Subscriptions are due on January 1 each year. 1993 rates: full members £25.00 (US\$ 55), student associates £10.00, corporate members £100, libraries (rate includes postage): £38.00 (US\$ 85). Life membership is available for £125.00 to those

FSA The Society, founded in 1910 and based in London, is the leading organization for all those interested in the study of Rome and the Roman Empire. Its scope is wide, covering Roman history, archaeology, literature and art down to about A.D.700. It has a broadly based membership, drawn from over 25 countries and from all ages and walks of life. The Society also publishes *Britannia*, a journal of Romano-British and connected studies, which includes an annual survey of Romano-British excavations.

The Society maintains with the Hellenic Society and in conjunction with the London University Institute of Classical Studies a joint library of works on classical antiquity and a collection of slides and film strips. Members resident in or visiting the U.K. may borrow books and slides and consult books belonging to the Institute. Meetings of the Society are held in London and in other parts of the U.K. together with other societies. Triennial conferences with the Hellenic Society and the Classical Association are held in either Oxford or Cambridge.

### THE CLASSICAL ASSOCIATION

The main aims of the Classical Association are to promote and sustain interest in classical studies, to maintain their rightful position in universities and schools and to give scholars and teachers opportunities of meeting and discussing their problems. It organises an annual conference in a university centre, and sponsors over 30 branches, which arrange programmes of lectures and discussions and many of which hold Greek and Latin Reading Competitions for Schools. Its activities are fully reported in its annual *Proceedings*, issued free to all members.

The present membership of the Association is approximately 4,000. Membership is open to individuals and institutions (annual subscription £3.00, life subscriptions (for individuals only) £63.00. Members may obtain the Classical Review and Classical Quarterly at reduced prices (Review, £20; Quarterly, £21; combined subscription £35). Greece and Rome may also be obtained through the Association for an annual subscription of £15. Applications for membership and subscriptions for the journals (which should normally be received by January 31st in each year) should be addressed to the Treasurer, Mr R. Wallace, Dept. of Classics, The University, Keele, Staffs ST5 5BG.

The Association can also supply copies of the Index to the First Series of the Classical Review (price for members £1.50 post free) and of the last issue of The Year's Work in Classical Studies, covering the years 1945-47 (price £1 post free).
