INSTRUCTIONS FOR CONTRIBUTORS

Send manuscripts and books for review to the editorial office. Manuscripts should run 6,000–11,000 words (or approximately 30–35 pages), not including endnotes, and should be double-spaced in 11- or 12-point font; endnotes must be printed double-spaced on separate pages following the text. The editors request an electronic submission (preferably by email attachment; cd-rom submissions sent to the address below will also be accepted) of the following items:

- (1) The manuscript (in order to protect the author's anonymity during the review process, the author's name should appear only on the title page of the essay);
- (2) A 200-word abstract (that is used during the review process and if *Church History* publishes the essay, the abstract may be included on the *Church History* webpage at www.churchhistory.org).

Please see www.churchhistory.org/churchhistoryguidelines.html for further manuscript submission guidelines. The editors will consider submissions of 70–90 pages for publication as "extended articles." Persons wishing to submit such manuscripts should query before sending them.






