INHALERS AND INHALANTS.

PINOL, MENTHOL, "EUCALYPTIA," TEREBENE,
CHLORIDE OF AMMONIUM.

THEIR THERAPEUTIC USES.

Pinol.

PINOL is the pure essence, or volatile oil, distilled from the needles of the *Pinus Pumilio*, growing amid the perpetual snow which covers the peaks of the Alps. The drug is largely employed in affections of the respiratory tract, including nasal catarrh, pharyngitis, quinsy, aphonia, asthma, pertussis, chronic bronchitis, and phthisis. For purposes of inhalation Pinol may be used by means of either the Pinol Steam Atomiser or the "Pinol-Eucalyptia" Dry Inhaler. The latter consists of a glass tube, something like a cigar in shape, filled with absorbent pine-wood chips. One end of the tube forms a glass mouth-piece, and at the other end is a piece of wire gauze. The Pinol is dropped into the wide end of the tube until the absorbent chips are saturated, and the Inhaler is then ready for use. By taking deep inspirations the air drawn through the Inhaler is fully charged with the vapour of the Pinol.


Terebene.

TEREBENE has been found of the most decided utility in the treatment of many bronchial troubles. The drug tends to liquefy the sputum and facilitate expectoration; these qualities are enhanced by its inherent antiseptic properties when employed as an inhalant in the treatment of chronic pulmonary affections, as it exerts its antiseptic influence at the seat of infection. If the vapour is to be inhaled dry, the Terebene may be used with a B., W. & Co. "Pinol-Eucalyptia" Dry Inhaler or a Menthol Pocket Inhaler.

Menthol.

MENTHOL possesses marked local anæsthetic, vascular, stimulant, and antiseptic properties. It produces prompt contraction of the vessels and acts as a sedative to the nerve terminations. It may be effectively employed in the form of snuff. The portable Oro-Nasal Menthol Inhaler is an excellent little instrument, designed by Dr. Macnaughton Jones, for the oral and nasal inhalation of Menthol in the cases cited. The case contains, besides the Inhaler, a solution of Menthol in Paroleine, and a camel-hair brush for applying the medicament direct to the mucous membrane of the
The case complete may be conveniently carried in the pocket. We also supply a
Inhaler, consisting of a simple glass tube filled with an absorbent medium. This is used in the same way as the "Pinol-Eucalyptia" Dry Inhaler.
